We found out that....

We discovered that.....

We hoped that..... (would)

She complained that.....

He said that..... =We don't know

He told me that.....

He claimed that..... =We think it's false

He agreed that.....

INDIRECT QUESTIONS:

He asked whether....

He didn't know whether....

He was not sure whether....

After the reporting verb, you have **3**
possible tenses for the next verb:

1) WOULD + INFINITIVE:

“I will be there.”

“I am going to be there.”

She said that she **WOULD be** there.

2) PAST SIMPLE (PAST CONTINUOUS):

“It is snowing now.”

“Bob hates me!”

She said that it **WAS** snowing then.

Bob **HATED** her.

3) PŘEDMINULÝ ČAS (= had + 3. tvar)

“When I was young, I was a star.”

“I haven't ever eaten a spider.”

She said that she **HAD BEEN** a star.

She said that she **HADn't EATEN** a spider.

The dog hoped that he wouldn't be heard.

The dog claimed that he had tasted/tried Truffles

He eats the sweets every year.

The baby said that dog had eaten all the sweets she had left on the table.

She claimed that he hadn't passed it.

**I have lunch at Oaze every Friday.
I am having lunch. (now)**

Mosh pit = misto na pogovaní

I was shocked multiple times by the evil psychiatrist.

Adrian claimed that he **had been shocked multiple times by the evil psychiatrist.**

To resemble = podobat

She said that she HAD BOUGHT Christmas decorations.

She said that she **WAS at work, and she said that she **WOULD MAKE** Christmas biscuits/sweets.**

My mum asked me if I was eating ok. She told me that when I had been at home, I had eaten better.

She said that she would be at the hairdresser's. She also said that the previous time it HAD BEEN horrible.
