## 7 Prepositions of TIME How to say *OD-DO* (desde-hasta) in English

If you know the start AND the end, you can say:

FROM June TO September, I will be in Brno. FROM when I arrived TO when I left, it rained.

## If you only know the start, say:

I will be there FROM/STARTING AT 4 o 'clock (*future*) FROM/STARTING December 15<sup>th</sup>.

I will be on holiday FROM July. (or from July on.)
I will be making a trailer for the Orli theatre starting in January.

I will be reading a book by Stan the man starting this evening.

Starting January 1<sup>st</sup>, I will..... (New Year's Resolution)

He has been here SINCE 4 o 'clock. (*past*) I have been playing the violin since I was 6.

## If you only know the end, say:

He will be there UNTIL/(TIL) midnight. She can talk until the cows come home.

Problems with deadlines (lhůty/plazos):

Ukončí zpravu DO tydne.

He will finish the report WITHIN a week.

Dasha will finish reading the book within 2 months.

The doctor gave him medicine, and he felt better within a few days.

He has to find a flat BY the end of the month. Musí si najit byt DO konce měsice.

WITHIN a period of time BY a precise time/date

By mid-May

We have to finish within a week.

We have to finish by the 12th of December.

I have been in Brno SINCE 2007.

We have been in this classroom since 8:30 (or maybe 8:45 for Agata).

I have to finish my homework by Monday night.

The engineer's wife told him: Go to the supermarket, and buy twelve rolls. If they have eggs, buy 6.

The engineer goes to the supermarket and buys 6 rolls.
