VERBS OF SUGGESTION

I suggest (you) to send the ukulele to the above address. \odot

$\frac{\text{Verb general for a specific person}}{\text{DRISPRP}}$

Demand		(that) s.b	+ INF. (without to)
Recommend	(doing s.th)	(that) s.b	+ INF.
Insist	(on doing it)	(that) s.b	+ INF.
Suggest	(doing it)	(that) s.b	+ INF.
Prefer	to do it	(that) s.b	+ INF.
Request		(that) s.b	+ INF.
Propose	doing it	(that) s.b	+ INF.

BONUS! This construction [(that) s.b + INF.] also works with impersonal constructions like:

It is essential	(that) s.b	+ INF.
It is crucial for DIFA	(that) s.b	+ INF.
It is necessary	(that) s.b	+ INF.

Examples of how to use these verbs for telling a specific person what to do:

We are hungry!

I suggest I request	(that) (that)	Clair <i>order</i> pancakes with chocolate chips. Suzanne NOT order American style pizza.
I demand minutes.	(that)	the food delivery arrive within 30
I recommended	(that)	the delivery guy (should) use a fast car.
