## TRANSITIVE VS. INTRANSITIVE VERB PAIRS

Transitive verbs need an object

(e.g. Set SOMETHING on the table).

Intransitive verbs cannot take an object.

As in Czech, sometimes the difference is only the interior vowel.

Intransitive: Lie (ležet) – lay – lain
Transitive: Lay (položit) – laid – laid

[Lie (lhát) – lied – lied]

Intransitive: Sit  $(sed \check{e}t) - sat - sat$ 

Transitive: Set (položit/umístit) - set - set

Intransitive: Rise (zvýšit se) – rose - risen

Transitive: Raise (zvýšit/zvedat) – raised – raised

Intransitive: Fall (padat) – fell - fallen
Transitive: Fell (kácet-) – felled – felled

[Feel (citit) – felt – felt]
