

## TRANSITIVE VS. INTRANSITIVE VERB PAIRS

Transitive verbs need an object

(e.g. Set **SOMETHING** on the table).

Intransitive verbs **cannot** take an object.

As in Czech, sometimes the difference is only the interior vowel.

Intransitive: **Lie** (**ležet**) – **lay** – **lain**

Transitive: **Lay** (**položít**) – **laid** – **laid**  
*[Lie (lhát) – lied – lied]*

Intransitive: **Sit** (**sedět**) – **sat** – **sat**

Transitive: **Set** (**položít/umístit**) – **set** – **set**

Intransitive: **Rise** (**zvýšit se**) – **rose** - **risen**

Transitive: **Raise** (**zvýšit/zvedat**) – **raised** – **raised**

Intransitive: **Fall** (**padat**) – **fell** - **fallen**

Transitive: **Fell** (**kácet**) – **felled** – **felled**  
*[Feel (cítit) – felt – felt]*
