FUTURE TENSE IN ENGLISH

60%

Present Continuous or "going to + inf." for things which are already planned "going to + inf." for predictions based on present evidence.

E.g.:

I'm heading home this weekend.

I'm going to watch a hockey match this evening.

Bob has only come to class three times. It looks like *Bob is going to fail* (in) English.

30%

"Will" for reactions to some condition (podmínka) or for predictions or offers/invitations (BrE) or promises. (Sometimes also for prices or future FACTS.)

E.g.:

If none of the actors come (!!) to class, I'll (=I will) just take a nap (=šlofik).

I'll just open the window now (since it's so hot in here).

The show *will be* fantastic. (Prediction)

That will be 15 quid, please.

The next President will take office in 2013.

10%

Present simple for timetables and agendas and programmes and calendars.

My train *leaves* at 4:00 this afternoon.

ENCOUNTER takes place in the second week of April this year.
