

## PREPOSITIONS OF TIME

### How to say *Od - Do* in English

1. If you know *the start and the end*, you can say:

From June to September, I will be in Brno.  
From when I arrived to when I left, it rained.

2. If you *only know the start*, say:

Starting at 4 o'clock, I will be there (*future*)  
(From December 15<sup>th</sup>.)

I will be on holiday starting in July.  
I will be making a trailer for the Orli theatre starting in January.  
I will be reading a book by Stan the man starting this evening.

He has/had been here since 4 o'clock. (*past*)  
I have been playing the violin since I was 6.

3. If you *only know the end*, say:

She will be there until/(til) midnight.  
He can talk until the cows come home.

*Problems with deadlines (lhůty/platnost):*

Within a period of time  
By a precise time/date

He has to find a new flat by the end of the month.

He will finish the report within a week.  
Dasha will finish reading the book within 2 months.  
The doctor gave him medicine, and he felt better within a few days.
